

#### **Road Traffic Accident Statistics 2015**

Analysis of National Crime Records Bureau Data, 2015

#### I. Introduction

As per the Accidental Deaths and Suicides in India 2015 report, 1,48,707 people were killed and 4,82,389 people were injured in 4,64,674 road accidents in India in 2015.

Road accident cases increased by 3.1 percent in the last one year (from 4,50,898 in 2014 to 4,64,674 in 2015). Fatalities increased by 5.1 percent (from 1,41,526 in 2014 to 1,48,707 in 2015).

Two wheelers have accounted for maximum fatal road accidents (43,540), contributing 29.3 percent of total road accidental deaths, followed by trucks/lorries (28,910 deaths), contributing to 19.4 percent, cars (18,506 deaths), contributing to 12.4 percent and buses (12,408 deaths), contributing to 8.3 percent of total road accidental deaths.

#### II. Age-group wise road crash deaths in 2015

- Children below the age of 18 years contribute to 10.5 percent of all fatalities
- 66.48 percent of all fatalities are among the productive age group of 18-45 years

## III. Most accident prone states and the variation in data between NCRB and TRW

There is a discrepancy in the data published by the Transport Research Wing's (TRW) Road Accidents in India 2015 and National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) with Uttar Pradesh having the highest fatalities in both.
